### PREPARING FOR YOUR SURGERY

- 1. Before surgery, it is imperative that we obtain a health history from you.
  - Within 14 days of your surgery you will receive a text message and/or email alert requesting you to complete this health history. If you have any difficulty signing in, please call 248.693.7950
  - If you do not have access to a cellular device or email, a nurse can take your information over the telephone. You can call (24%) 693-7950 to be connected to a nurse.

# \*If your health history is not received at least 24 hours before surgery, you will be rescheduled for another day.

- Arrange for a responsible adult to accompany you to the surgery center and to drive you home. You will not be allowed to drive yourself after having anesthesia. It is our expectation that your companion stays at the surgery center during the entirety of your stay.
- 3. If you are having a hip or knee replacement, a member or our Pre-Operative department will be contacting you to attend the Joint Replacement Class prior to your surgical day.
- 4. Review and follow the instructions your surgeon has provided to you.

#### DAY BEFORE & MORNING DAY OF SURGERY

- Do not eat, drink or smoke after midnight before your surgery, unless you have been directed otherwise. This
  includes water, mints, candy and gum.
- 2. Wash with an anti-bacterial soap the evening before and the morning of surgery. This is to minimize the risk of infection.
- 3. Medications may be taken with a sip of water.
- 4. You may brush your teeth, but do not swallow any water.
- 5. Plan to wear comfortable clothing. In addition, continue to follow any other instructions
- 6. Leave all valuables, including jewelry at home.

#### **Financial Obligations**

Depending on your specific health care plan, we may be required to collect a deductible and co-insurance amounts from you at the time of service. You will be contacted electronically (text message, email) or by our registration department if a payment is due at the time of service.

#### YOUR DAY OF SURGERY

- Upon arrival to Michigan Institute for Advanced Surgery you will be welcomed and checked in by our receptionist.
- Shortly after, a nurse from the pre-operative area will greet you and begin to prepare you for surgery. Your companion will be asked to wait in the lobby until this process is completed.
- 3. You will be asked to sign a few more documents and change into a surgical gown. Your nurse will check your temperature, blood pressure, heart rate and insert an IV catheter.
- The remainder of your surgical team will introduce themselves, including the anesthesiologist and your surgeon.
- 5. Your companion may join you at this time in the pre-operative area until you are taken to the operating room.
- 6. Immediately prior to surgery you will be required to remove any dentures or contact lenses that you may have.

#### YOUR RECOVERY

- After surgery you will wake up in the recovery room. Here your nurse will help to manage your discomfort you are having.
- 2. Once awake and comfortable, your companion will be welcomed into the recovery room where your nurse will review your discharge instructions with you both. Due to the medications received during surgery, it is very common for you not to remember the information given to you at this time. Therefore, it is important your companion be involved in the process.
- 3. Typically, you will be ready to go home within 30 minutes to 2 hours after surgery.
- 4. You will be escorted to your car via wheelchair, so you can begin the next step in healing.
- 5. Your surgical recovery matters to us! You will receive a email and/or text message thought the surgical portal to check on you. These responses are monitored by the nurses daily, questions or concerns will be followed up by a phone call to you.

\*We are closed Weekends and Holidays, you will be contacted the following business day if your surgery is immediately prior.
